



Safety

Krakow is a safe city, but it also one of the largest cities in Europe. You need to remember about basic safety rules, especially during the tourist season when a lot of people visit the city. In case of a threat, contact the emergency number (phone number: 112), the Police (997) or the City Guard officer on duty (986).

In the street:

- In the evening, be sure to choose brightly lit streets used by people. Avoid dark, deserted areas (parks, gardens, courtyards, side streets).
- Never leave documents, money and mobile phones in easily accessible and visible spots.

While travelling:

- Be careful when using public transport. It is easier to get robbed in a crowd.

Vehicles:

- When leaving your vehicle, even for a while, make sure that all of the windows are closed, the boot is locked and the alarm is on.
- Never leave documents inside the vehicle.
- If you are going to see the city without a vehicle, leave the keys in a safe place, such as your hotel room.

Currency exchange bureaus:

- Money can be exchanged at exchange bureaus and banks. Banks usually charge a commission, and the exchange is less profitable.
- When exchanging money in an exchange bureau, pay attention to the exchange rates. You may also compare them with other bureaus or with the rates published at www.nbp.pl.

IMPORTANT:

Before you conclude a transaction:

- Compare the exchange rate displayed outside the exchange bureau with the one offered inside!
- Determine the transaction amount, remembering that exchange bureaus apply various rates depending on the currency, the value of the transaction and the object of the transaction (coins, banknotes, etc.).

Be sure to ask about all the information available at the exchange bureau with respect to the proposed exchange rate. It is best simply to ask for the exact amount you will receive. If you have any doubts and the bureau owner refuses to give you an answer, exchange your money elsewhere.

REMEMBER:

In case of a potential dispute, if you are a citizen of a EU Member State, Norway or Iceland, you can ask the European Consumer Centre (www.konsument.gov.pl) for help.



City Guard

Krakow is a city with a tradition of a thousand years, a former seat of Polish monarchs and a place of many events important for the history of Poland and Europe. This is why city authorities and policing services ask for proper behaviour, allowing tourists to enjoy the city without disrupting the life of its citizens. The organisations responsible for maintaining order in the city are the Police and the City Guard.

In order to avoid problems while visiting Poland, remember:

Misdemeanours subject to a fine:

- In public places, alcohol may be consumed exclusively in spots intended for this purpose. Failing to observe this regulation is punishable by a PLN 100 penalty fine. Attempting to consume alcohol is also subject to a penalty. Foreigners pay the fine directly to the officer at the spot of committing the misdemeanour.
- Disrupting the peace, littering, public manifestation of socially unacceptable behaviour (e.g. loud screaming, urinating, vomiting) are also subject to a penalty.
- Smoking cigarettes in forbidden places, such as public transport stops, playgrounds or parks, is subject to a penalty.

Court proceedings:

- You can refuse to accept a mandate. In such a case, as a foreigner, you will be taken directly to be questioned and then to court for a hearing.
- Selling alcohol to minors and persons intoxicated with alcohol is a criminal offence!



How to help

Krakow has a number of institutions offering help to the poor. Nobody in need is left without help. However, there are people who treat begging as a good way of making money on the pretext of collecting it for medicine or food.

Remember: Do not give your money to people begging in the streets! Your money may be used for purchasing alcohol. Do not give your money to children and young people offering flowers, newspapers, pictures, beer pads, street shows, etc. By giving them money, you take away their childhood.



For motorised tourists

ATTENTION!

The streets in the city centre are divided into three zones:

- **Paid parking zone divided into 3 sub-zones: P1, P2 and P3** – traffic is not limited, but you have to pay for parking. Payments can be made at parking meters, via mobile phone, with the KKM card or with a payment card (currently only in the Kazimierz district, i.e. in sub-zone P2, from 1 April) or by means of purchasing a resident license.
- **Zones A and B** – areas where traffic is limited and parking is permitted only for vehicles with special labels or with a paid resident license.

If you are driving a vehicle, you must be in possession of:

- Driving licence,
- Vehicle registration card,
- Automobile liability insurance.

Remember:

- Permissible alcohol levels in the driver's body:
 - less than 0.02% in blood, or
 - less than 0.1 mg/dm³ in exhaled air.
- Your vehicle must be equipped with seatbelts. The driver and the passengers are obligated to have their seatbelts fastened while the vehicle is in motion.
- Children under 12 and shorter than 150 cm should travel in a booster seat appropriate for the child's height and weight.
- While driving, vehicle headlights must be turned on both during the day and at night.

Obligatory vehicle equipment:

- Fire extinguisher,
- Warning triangle.

Please remember that there are traffic limitations in the city centre, pay attention to road signs, avoid improper parking and try to use public transport. Please remember about the obligation to purchase a parking ticket when leaving your car in the Limited Parking Zone (Monday to Friday, 10. a.m. to 8 p.m.).
