## What to see in Krakow? Krakow's best known historic landmarks.

The city boasts hundreds of historical buildings, from medieval churches to Art Nouveau edifices. Krakow's most popular ancient monuments are Wawel Royal Castle (Zamek Krolewski na Wawelu), Wawel Cathedral (Katedra Wawelska), St. Mary's church (Kosciol Mariacki), Collegium Maius, Cloth Hall (Sukiennice), Barbican (Barbakan), St. Florian Gate (Brama Florianska), Tyniec Abbey (Opactwo

Tynieckie), and Old Synagogue (Stara Boznica). There are also more than 36 museums, from National Museum, to Modern Art Museum.
